Provide in-person testimony: Public Testimony will be taken during the meeting via videoconference from the conference room across from the Hilo Council Chambers at 25 Aupuni St and at the Kona Council Office Conference Room at West HI Civic Center, Bldg A. Testifiers are required to wear a mask that covers their mouth and nose, physically distance from others, and sanitize prior to entering the testimony site.

Gov. David Ige announced the delay of pre-travel testing program for incoming travelers to Hawai'i. The program is now scheduled to begin on Sept. 1. This means all travelers entering the State of Hawai'i will be subject to the mandatory 14-day quarantine until Sept. 1, when the pre-travel testing program is scheduled to begin.

Once launched, the pre-travel testing program overview includes: Travelers exempt from the 14-day quarantine if they test negative after taking a COVID-19 test no more than 72 hours in advance of travel /// The test must be a nucleic acid amplification test or NAAT test conducted at a CLIA-certified laboratory /// If test results are not available by the time of arrival in Hawai'i, the traveler will remain in quarantine until their test results are received /// If the test results are negative and can be verified, the traveler will then be exempt from the quarantine /// All travelers are subject to the pre-test requirement, including children of all ages /// Travelers are responsible for the cost of the test - No commercial testing will be provided at Hawai'i airports.
